 of the United States do by these presents Nominate constitute  
 and appoint William Wallace of the Borough of Carlisle in  
 the County of Cumberland and State of Pennsylvania my  
 true and Lawful Attorney in my name and for my Use to  
 Receive from the Common Wealth of Pennsylvania the  
 Donation Land promised me by the said Common Wealth  
 in Consideration of my Services during the Revolutionary  
 War. and I do hereby Give and Grant unto my said  
 Attorney full power and authority to do every act and  
 thing relative to the obtaining of said Land in as full  
 and Effectual a manner as I myself could do were  
 I personally present hereby ratifying and Confirming  
 whatever my said Attorney shall lawfully do in the  
 premises. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set  
 my hand, & Seal the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of November in the  
 year of our Lord one thousand Eight Hundred —
