

To the Honorable the General Assembly of the Commonwealth
of Pennsylvania, the memorial of Hugh W. Grevey,

Respectfully sheweth,

That your memorialist was a Soldier of Capt. William
Grey's Company, of the Fourth Regiment of the Pennsylvania
Line, and that he continued in the Public Service, until
the close of the War, when he was discharged by Col.
Richard Butler. That in consideration of his services,
he was ~~is~~ entitled to a tract of Donation Land from
the State, and that he has never sold or conveyed his
right to any person; but that owing to his repro-
sion of the law, his remote situation from the
seat of Government, and his attention to the means of
maintaining himself and his family, he neglected
to make an application for a Patent for his tract
of land, till the limitation for receiving such applica-
tions became a legal bar. That under these cir-
cumstances, your Memorialist trusts the justice and
generosity of the Government, will not permit an ad-
vantage to be taken of the mere lapse of time; and
prays that he may be allowed to ^{present} ~~beneficial~~ a
Bill for his relief in the premises.
