 Heck the said Tract of Land with the Appurtenances and to the only
 proper use and behoof of the said Daniel Heck his Heirs and Assigns
 forever hereby also sufficiently warranting and forever defending
 the said Tract of Land and Appurtenances unto the said Daniel
 Heck his Heirs and Assigns Against every person or persons lawfully
 claiming or to claim from by or under the said John Miller In
 Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
 Twenty seventh day of March Anno Domini One thousand
 seven hundred eighty seven
