 of Pennsylvania our true and trusty attorney for us and
 in our names and for our use to ask demand and receive at the
 proper offices of this Common wealth all that donation of land of
 land which the said Joseph O'Hara was entitled to for his services by
 Virtue of a law of said Common wealth in such cases made
 and provided which may be justly due said Joseph O'Hara as
 a soldier for his services aforesaid giving and granting unto our
 said attorney our full power strength and authority in our name
 to make Seal and deliver In Witness whereof We have hereunto
 set our hands & Seals, this 7th day of November 1803
