To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

KNOW YE,

Bates private

That in consideration of the services rendered by George in the late army of the United States there is granted by the said commonwealth unto the said George Bates a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of Westmoreland, In the eighth District of the Division Lands Beginning at a Beech tree the numbered corner running East by Lot No 1510 One hundred and eighty four perches to a Bach, thence South by Lot No 101 One hundred and eighty five perches to a pine tree, thence West by Lot No 1511 One hundred and eighty four perches to an Elm thence North by Lot No 1505 One hundred and eighty four perches to the place of Beginning containing Two hundred acres and allowance of six per cent for roads for a hundred acres.

with its appurtenances, unto the said George Bates his heirs and assigns forever : TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said George Bates his heirs and assigns, to the proper use and behoof of the said George Bates his heirs and assigns forever, free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth clear of all charges. IN WITNESS whereof, The Honorable Charles Biddle Esquire, Vice President of the Supreme Executive Council, hath hereunto set his hand, and caused the state seal to be affixed the Twenty-sixth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty-seven, and of the commonwealth the Eleventh.
