To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

KNOW YE,

That in consideration of the services rendered by James Cowhawk private

in the late army of the United States

there is granted by the said commonwealth unto the said James Cowhawk a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of Westmoreland in the tenth district of the Union Land Beginning at an Elm tree the numbered corner running east by Lot N^o. 2140 Two hundred & sixty one perches to a Maple thence South by Lot N^o. 2151 one hundred and thirty perches to a Beech thence West by Lot N^o. 2132 Two hundred and sixty one perches to a Sugar thence North by Lot N^o. 2126 One hundred and thirty perches to the place of beginning containing Two hundred acres and allowance of six per cent for Roads for numbered MM
XXXIX

with its appurtenances, unto the said James Cowhawk his heirs and assigns forever:

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto

the said James Cowhawk his heirs and assigns, to the proper use and behoof of the said

James Cowhawk his heirs and assigns forever, free and clear of all restrictions and

reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth clear of all charges. IN WITNESS whereof The Honorable Charles Bidle

Esquire, Vice President of the Supreme Executive Council, hath hereunto set his hand, and caused the state seal to be affixed the Twenty-third day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty-seven, and of the commonwealth the Eleventh.
