To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

KNOW YE,

That in consideration of the services rendered by Jacob

Dicks private

in the late army of the United States

there is granted by the said commonwealth unto the said Jacob Dicks

a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of Westmoreland in the

10th District of the Donation Lands Beginning at a Sugar tree the numbered corner and running  
East by lot 5<sup>th</sup> 2002 Two hundred and sixty one perches to a Sugar, thence South by vacant land One hun  
dred thirty perches to a Birch, thence West by lot 8<sup>th</sup> 2000 Two hundred and sixty one perches to a Sugar tree  
thence North by lot 4<sup>th</sup> 2119 One hundred thirty perches to the place of Beginning containing Four hun  
dred Acres allowance of six per cent for Roads of numbered MMI

with its appurtenances, unto the said Jacob Dicks

his heirs and assigns forever :

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto

the said Jacob Dicks

his heirs and assigns, to the proper use and behoof of the said

Jacob Dicks his heirs and assigns forever, free and clear of all restrictions and  
reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth

part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth  
clear of all charges. IN WITNESS whereof The Honorable Charles Biddle

the state seal to be affixed the Twenty three day of February in the year of our Lord one
