

The Supreme Executive Council of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

NOW YE,

That in consideration of the services rendered by Randolph
Wth (deceased) late a Sergeant in the army of the United States —
there is granted by the said commonwealth unto William Guthrie administrators
of the Good and Chattels Rights and Credits of the said Randolph Death (deceased)

a certain tract or parcel of land, lying in the county of Westmoreland —
In the second district of donation Lands beginning at a post and White Oak the numbered
Corner and running South by lot N^o. 1809 two hundred and sixty one and a half perches
to a Walnut, thence East by lot N^o. 135 one hundred and sixty three perches to a
Dogwood, thence North by lot N^o. 1808 two hundred and sixty one and a half perches
to a beech tree, thence West by Vacant Lands one hundred and sixty three perches
to the place of beginning Containing two hundred and fifty Acres and allowance
of Six per Cent for Roads &c Numbered CLXXXIV

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said
William Guthrie his — heirs and assigns forever, In trust Nevertheless and to
and for the use of the Heirs of the said deceased according to the Laws of this
Commonwealth —

free and clear of all restrictions and
reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents, or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth
part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth
clear of all charges. IN WITNESS whereof His Excellency Benjamin Franklin —
Esquire, — President of the Supreme Executive Council, hath hereunto set his hand, and caused
the State seal to be affixed the twenty fourth day of August — in the year of our Lord one
thousand seven hundred and eighty seven and of the commonwealth the twelfth —
