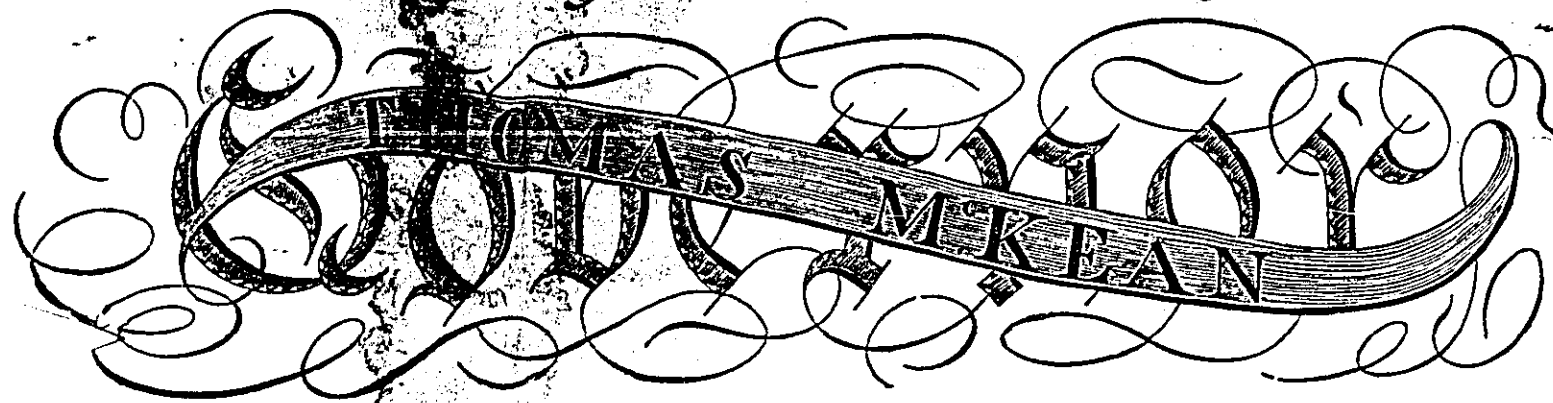


In the Name and by the Authority of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania,



of the said Commonwealth,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:



Now ye, That in consideration of the services rendered by Richard Ennis private in the late Army of the United States and in the Pennsylvania Line - there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto Mary Ennis, widow of the said Richard Ennis dec'd a certain Tract of land No 238 called "Mary's Lot" Situate in donation District No 2, in Butler County beginning at a black Oak thence by a black line No 3, West two hundred sixty one perches to a black Oak, thence by No 270, South one hundred thirty perches to a black Oak, thence by No 39, East two hundred sixty one perches to a white Oak, and thence by vacant land, North one hundred thirty perches to the beginning being Two hundred Acres and Allowance of six off Cent for roads &c, which said Tract was surveyed in pursuance of an Act of the Assembly passed 21st February 1735.

and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances, unto the said Mary Ennis and her Heirs to the use of her the said Mary Ennis her Heirs and assigns forever.

free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to Mines, Royalties, Quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all Gold and Silver for the use of this Commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth, clear of all charges. In Testimony whereof, I have set my Hand, and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed to these Presents this twenty fourth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and three and of the Commonwealth the twenty seventh.
