


In the Name and by the Authority of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Know ye, That in consideration of the services rendered by Richard Ennis, while in the late Army of the United States and in the Pennsylvania Line - there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto Mary Ennis, widow of the said Richard Ennis deceased, a certain Tract of land No. 238 called "Mary's Lot" Situate in donation District No. 2, in Butler County, Beginning at a Black Oak thence by

lot line No. 3, West two hundred sixty one perches to a Black Oak, thence by N. 270, South one hundred thirty perches to a Black Oak, thence E. 30, East two hundred sixty one perches to a white Oak, and thence by a vacant land, North one hundred thirty perches to the Beginning Two hundred Acres and a moiety of six feet, being four rods 80, Which said Tract was surveyed in pursuance of an Act of the Assembly passed 24th February 1735.

and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances, unto the said, Mary Ennis and her Heirs to the use of her the said Mary Ennis her Heirs and
forever.

free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to Mines, Royalties, Quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all Gold and
for the use of this Commonwealth, to be delivered at the Pitt's mouth, clear of all charges. In Testimony whereof, I have set my Hand, and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed to these
