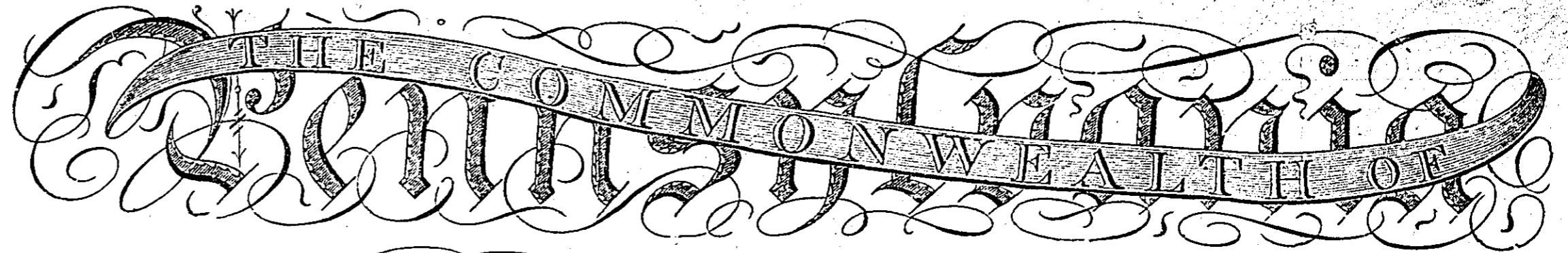

Know ye, That in consideration of the services rendered by Philip Hitchcock private in the army of the said Commonwealth there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto Clement Biddle esquire assignee of Edward Harper who was assignee of the said Philip Hitchcock a certain tract

in the county of Allegheny on the West side of the Allegheny River in the sixth donation District, bounded and described to wit, Beginning at an Aspen-bush and running East by Lot Number 1298, one hundred and thirty perches to thence South by Lot Number 1282, Two hundred and sixty one perches to a Stake; thence West by Lot number one hundred and thirty perches, to a White-oak; and thence North by Lot number 1284, - Two hundred and sixty one perches to the place of beginning; containing Two hundred acres of Land and the usual allowance of six per cent for roads numbered among other Lots in the said District - MCCLXXXIII.

To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said Clement Biddle his heirs and assigns To and for the use and behoof forever

free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of the said tract for the use of this Commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth clear of all charges. In Testimony whereof I have set my Hand, and caused the great Seal of the said Commonwealth to be hereunto affixed, at Philadelphia, this tenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety-five and of the Commonwealth the Nineteenth
