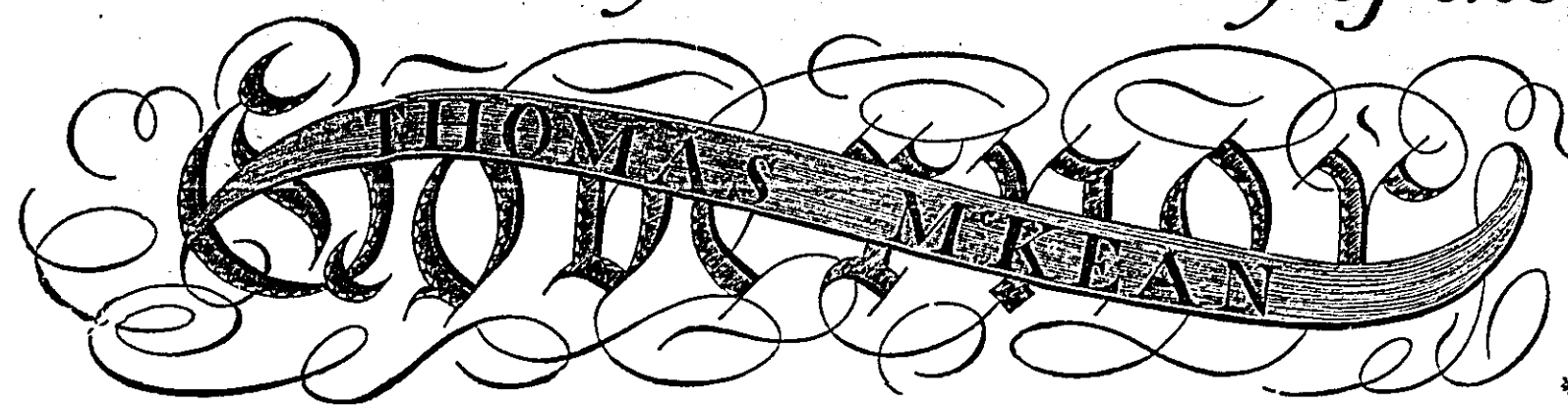


In the Name and by the Authority of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:



Now ye, That in consideration of the services rendered by Christian Hartman private — in the late Army of the United States and of the — there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto the said Christian Hartman a certain tract of land No: 250 called "Liberty farm" — situated in the II. Southern District now in Butler County Beginning at a Quaking Ash, thence by lot No: 209, East two hundred and — to a Quaking Ash, thence by lot No: 203, South one hundred and thirty perches to a white oak, thence by lot No: 281, West two hundred and — to a white oak, and thence by lot No: 287, North one hundred and thirty perches to the Beginning containing Two hundred Acres and Allowance — which said tract was surveyed in pursuance of an act of the General Assembly passed the 21th February 1785.

to hold the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said Christian Hartman and — his Heirs to the use of him the said Christian Hartman his Heirs —

free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to Mines, Royalties, Quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all Gold and — the use of this Commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth, clear of all charges. In Testimony whereof, I have set my Hand, and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed to these — this fifteenth day of June — in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and four and of the Commonwealth the twenty-eighth.
