

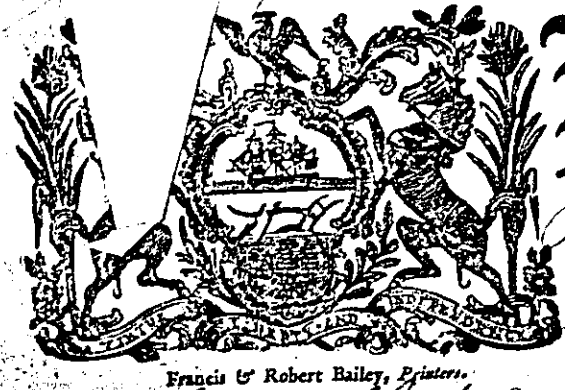

of the said Commonwealth,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:



Know ye, That in consideration of the services rendered by Cornelius Huffman private in the late Army of the United States and in the Pennsylvania Line - there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto the said Cornelius Huffman a certain tract of land N^o 221, called "Liberty" situate in Conantown District N^o 2, in Butler County Beginning at a Post thence by N^o 220 East two hundred sixty one perches to a black Oak, thence by N^o 221 South one hundred thirty perches to a sapling tree, thence by N^o 222 West two hundred sixty one perches to a white Oak, and thence by N^o 223 North one hundred thirty perches to the Beginning, containing Two hundred Acres, and allowance of six ft⁶ Cent for roads &c. (Which said Tract was surveyed in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly passed 24th February 1785.)

To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said Cornelius Huffman and his Heirs to the use of him the said Cornelius Huffman his Heir and Assigns forever.

free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to Mines, Royalties, Quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all Gold and Silver Ore for the use of this Commonwealth, to be delivered at the pitt's mouth, clear of all charges. In Testimony whereof, I have set my Hand, and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed to these Presents, at Lancaster this second day of March - in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and three - and of the Commonwealth the twenty-seventh.
