


In the Name and by the Authority of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania,


of the said Commonwealth,
To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Now ye, That in consideration of the services rendered by John Jordan formerly in the late Army of the United States and in the
Armies of France — there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto the said John Jordan a certain tract of land bounded
being donation of land in Butler County, Beginning at a black oak thence by lot No. 232 West, two hundred
feet, thence by N.W. 35 South one hundred fifty paces to a white stone thence by N.E. 230 East two hundred
feet, and thence by N.W. 35 South one hundred thirty paces to the Beginning containing two hundred thousand square
feet, which said tract was surveyed in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly passed the 24th
February 1785.

or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said John Jordan and his Heirs to the use of him the said John Jordan

free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to Mines, Royalties, Quir rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all Gold and
silver, to be delivered at the Pitt's mouth, clear of all charges. In Testimony whereof, I have set my Hand, and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed to these
twelve days of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and six and of the Commonwealth the twenty-ninth.

I now all men by these presents, that I Samuel Lendin in whom the right to the above Patent, by means of sundry conveyances, duly executed, is vested, for
and in consideration of an tract of 200^{acres} being granted to me, by the said Office of the State of Pennsylvania, agreeably to Law, Do grant, bargain, sell, alien, or under
let the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, all my right, title, and interest, in and to the above granted tract of land with the appurtenances. To have
and to hold the same, to the only proper use and benefit of the said Commonwealth forever. Witness my hand and seal this twenty-first day of March A.D. 1808
