

The Supreme Executive Council of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

KNOW YE,

That in consideration of the services rendered by William

Lee Sergeant —

in the late army of the United States

there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto the said William Lee

a certain tract or parcel of Land, lying in the county of Allegany

In the tenth district of donation lands Beginning at a Beech tree the numbered corner  
and running East by Lot N<sup>o</sup> 206 two hundred and sixty one perches to a Beech tree thence  
South by Lot N<sup>o</sup> 196 one hundred and sixty two perches and  $\frac{5}{6}$  of a Perch to a Beech tree  
West by Lot N<sup>o</sup> 204 two hundred and sixty one perches to a Sugar tree thence North by  
vacant Land one hundred and sixty two and  $\frac{5}{6}$  of a perch to a Beech tree the place of Be  
ginning containing Two hundred and fifty acres and allowance of six per cent for Roads  
etc. a Numbered 205

with its appurtenances, unto the said William Lee — his heirs and assigns forever:

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the  
said William Lee — his heirs and assigns, to the proper use and behoof of the said

William Lee — his heirs and assigns forever, free and clear of all restrictions and  
reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents, or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth  
part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this Commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth  
clear of all charges. IN WITNESS whereof His Excellency Thomas Mifflin

the State seal to be affixed the Eleventh — day of February — in the year of our Lord one  
thousand seven hundred and eighty nine and of the Commonwealth the thirteenth
