

The Supreme Executive Council of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

To all to whom these Presents shall come GREETING :

KNOW YE,

That in consideration of the services rendered by

William Mackey Esquire Captain in the late army of the United States

there is granted by the said commonwealth unto the said *William Mackey*

a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of *Westmoreland*

in the tenth District of Donation Lands Beginning at a Buck the numbered Corner and running East by Lot N° 1927 & 1932 Three hundred and twenty five perches to a Sugar, thence South by Lot N° 183 Two hundred and sixty one perches to a Sugar, thence West by Lot N° 191 Three hundred twenty five perches to a Buck, thence North by Lot N° 145 Two hundred and sixty one perches to the place of Beginning containing Five hundred Acres and allowance of six per cent for Roads &c Numbered LXXIV

with its appurtenances unto the said *William Mackey* his heirs and assigns forever:

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the

said *William Mackey* his heirs and assigns, to the proper use and behoof of the said

William Mackey his heirs and assigns forever, free and clear of all restrictions and

reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth

part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth

clear of all charges. IN WITNESS whereof *The Honorable Charles Biddle*

Esquire, Vice President of the Supreme Executive Council, hath heretunto set his hand, and caused

the state seal to be affixed the *Sixth* day of *November* in the year of our Lord one
