To all to whom these Presents shall come GREETING:

KNOW YE,

Pine Matross late

That in consideration of the services rendered by

John —

in the army of the United States —

there is granted by the said commonwealth unto the said John Pine —

a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of Westmoreland
In the tenth district of donation Lands beginning at a sugar Tree the numbered Cor-
ner and running East by Lot No. 2085 two hundred and fifty one perches to a sugar Tree,
thence South by Lot No. 2093 one hundred and thirty perches to an Ash Tree, thence
West by Lot No. 2068 two hundred and sixty one perches to an Ash Tree, thence North
by Lot No. 2056 one hundred and thirty perches to the place of beginning containing
Two hundred feet and a thousand rods for Roads &c Numbered M.M.LXXX

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said
John Pine his heirs and assigns forever, to the proper use and behoof of the
said John Pine his Heirs and Assigns forever.

free and clear of all restrictions and
reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth
part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth
clear of all charges. IN WITNESS whereof His Excellency Benjamin Franklin
Esquire, President of the Supreme Executive Council, hath hereunto set his hand, and caused
the state seal to be affixed the Nineteenth day of April — in the year of our Lord one
thousand seven hundred and eighty seven and of the commonwealth the Eleventh.
