KNOW YE,

That in consideration of the services rendered by ~~the~~
~~Honorable Arthur St. Clair Esquire Major General~~ in the late army of the ~~United States~~
there is granted by the said commonwealth unto ~~the said Arthur St. Clair~~
a certain tract or parcel of land, lying in the county of Westmoreland
In the tenth district of donation lands beginning at a sugar tree the numbered corner and
running East by lot N^o 182 three hundred and twenty five perches to an Elm tree, thence South
by lot N^o 191 two hundred and fifty one perches to a sugar tree, thence West by lot N^o 184
three hundred and twenty five perches to a beech tree, thence North by lot N^o 190 and N^o 191
two hundred and fifty one perches to the place of beginning Containing a full hundred Acres
and allowance of six per cent for Roads &c. ~~Number CLXXXIII.~~

with its appurtenances, unto the said ~~Arthur St. Clair~~ his heirs and assigns forever:
TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the
said ~~Arthur St. Clair~~ his heirs and assigns, to the proper use and behoof of the said
~~Arthur St. Clair~~ his heirs and assigns forever, free and clear of all restrictions and
reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents, or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth
part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth

the State seal to be affixed the twenty first day of August in the year of our Lord one
