and running East by Lot N<sup>o</sup>. 2125 two hundred and sixty one perches to an Elm Tree, thence South  
by Lot N<sup>o</sup>. 2139 one hundred and thirty perches to a Sugar Tree, thence West by Lot N<sup>o</sup>. 2127 two hun-  
dred and sixty one perches to a Beech Tree, thence North by Lot N<sup>o</sup>. 2111 one hundred and thirty  
perches to the place of beginning, Containing two hundred Acres and Allowance of Sixty  
Cent for Roads &c. Numbered MDCXXVI.

reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth  
part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth
