

"Resolved

In Senate January 5<sup>th</sup> 1810

That the secretary of the land office be and he hereby is required to inform senate whether any warrants of acceptance issued previous to the passage of the act of the thirteenth of March one thousand eight hundred and seventeen entitled "An act to authorise the officers of the land-office to accept returns of surveys and direct patents to issue where an excess of more than ten per cent is returned" where warrants had previously issued and if any, what fees were charged thereon and if none why a fee of four dollars and fifty cents is charged for a warrant of acceptance in case of a warrant and two dollars in case of a location where the fee for the original warrant was four dollars and fifty cents and that of a location one dollar thereby obliging the warrantee to pay nine dollars and the locator only three."
