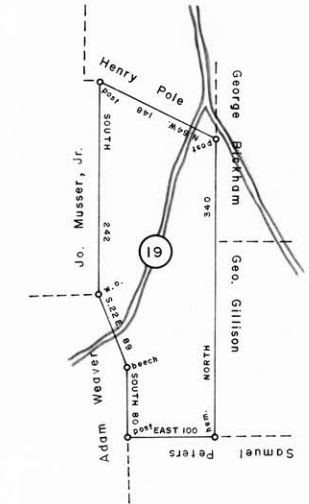


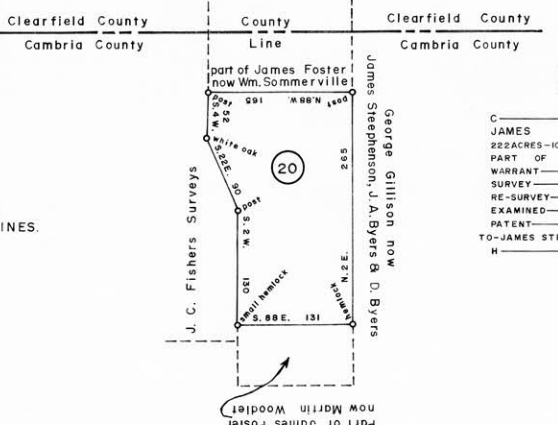

NOTE: TRACT NO. 19 SHOWN AT THE BOTTOM LEFT (AND ALSO SHOWN ON THE MAIN MAP) WAS SURVEYED ON AUGUST 25th 1800 AND IT WAS RE-SURVEYED AND CORRECTED ON OCTOBER 5th 1804.

TRACT NO. 20 SHOWN AT THE BOTTOM RIGHT (AND ALSO SHOWN ON THE MAIN MAP) IS SUPPOSED TO BE PART OF TRACT NO. 19. THE SURVEY STATES THAT IT (TRACT NO. 20) WAS EXAMINED BY Henry Scanlon D.S. ON JULY 6th & 7th 1868 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PATENTING PART OF TRACT NO. 19 TO James Steephenson, John A. Byers & David Byers. TRACT NO. 20 WAS ACCEPTED FOR PATENT BECAUSE IT WAS PART OF TRACT NO. 19. HOWEVER IT CAN EASILY BE SEEN THAT THE DISTANCES OF TRACT NO. 20 ARE TOO GREAT. THEY DID NOT STAY WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF TRACT NO. 19 WHICH IS THE MASTER SURVEY. THIS IS REQUIRED WHEN A TRACT IS PATENTED IN PART THEREFORE TRACT NO. 20 INFRINGES & OVERLAPS ON TO THE WESTERN SIDE OF TRACT NO. 21 AND ALSO ON TO THE NORTHWESTERN CORNER OF TRACT NO. 24 AS SHOWN ON THE MAIN MAP BY BROKEN LINES.



A CONNECTED DRAFT of fifty-one (51) tracts of land, which when surveyed, were situate as follows: thirty-four (34) in Allegheny Township, Huntingdon County, six (6) in Chest Township, Huntingdon (now Clearfield) County, two (2) in Frankstown Township, Huntingdon County, nine (9) in Allegheny Township, Huntingdon (now Cambria) County: The draft has been constructed from and compared with the original drafts on file in the Bureau of Land Records, Department of Community Affairs, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, under the direction of Edward D. Price, Director.
