 Samuel Beneyet Administrator of the goods and
 Chattles rights credits and Effects of Samuel Beneyet
 late of the Township of Bensalem in the County of
 Bucks deceased by and with the advice and consent
 of my mother Ann Beneyet and my sister Ann
 Jane Beneyet have Manumitted and do hereby
 myself my heirs Executors and administrators
 commit and set free any Negro Woman named Lydia
 Highgate aged between twenty seven and twenty eight
 years and I do hereby give grant and release unto the
 said Lydia Highgate all any Right Title and Claim
 in and to her Person Labour and Service and of and
 into the Estate and property she may hereafter acquire
 or obtain. In Testimony I have hereunto set my
 hand and seal this first day of September in the
 year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and

Be it remembered that I John Wilson of the Township of South-
 ampton Bucks County Esquire have and by these presents do enlarge
 set free from bondage and at liberty a certain Negro Man named Landon
 Samuel West duly registered a Slave in November 1780 then aged one
 Year and I do for myself my Executors & Administrators remise release
 quit Claim right and title in the said Negro Man hereby declaring
 him to be a free Man in future and that without the least molestation or
 hindrance of me or any claimants under me. In witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand & seal this fourth of December eighteen hundred
 and three

 appeared John Wilson Esquire and after reading
 the above written Manumission for setting free his
 Negro Man Landon he fully acknowledged it to be his
 own free Voluntary act & deed & desired it might
 be recorded as such Witness my hand & seal
