NOTE C.—Enumerators will observe that there are 100 questions relating to each farm, which are arranged in four successive divisions of each schedule page.

Table with columns: Hay, Clover Seed, Grass Seed, Horses of all ages on hand June 1, 1880, Mules and Asses of all ages on hand June 1, 1880. Rows 1-10.

Table of the person who conducts this farm, acres of land (improved/unused), farm values, fences, labor, and grass lands. Rows 1-10.

Table of poultry on hand June 1st, 1880, eggs produced in 1879. Rows 1-10.

Table of neat cattle and their products, sheep, and swine. Rows 1-10.

Table of maple-1879, broom corn-1879. Rows 1-10.

Table of cereals (barley, buckwheat, Indian corn, oats, rye, wheat), pulse, fiber, sugar, and broom corn. Rows 1-10.

Table of forest products. Rows 1-10.

Table of hops, potatoes, tobacco, orchards, nurseries, vineyards, market gardens, bees, and forest products. Rows 1-10.
