



By Virtue of a Warrant dated the 2<sup>d</sup> September 1784

Surveyed the 3<sup>d</sup> October 1785 to Abraham Lukens the above described tract of land situate on a brook called half way brook being a branch of Shoholy creek and on the path from Shoholy house to the Mouth of Lechawaxsin— in Northampton County. Containing Four hundred and twenty one acres a quarter and the allowance of Six P. Cent &c.
