



In pursuance of an order from the Commissioner of Property, dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1772, a survey was made on the 3<sup>d</sup> of July following of a certain Lot of Ground in the Town of Sunbury in the County of Northumberland Numbered one hundred and forty eight, containing in breadth East and West sixty feet, and in length North and South Two hundred and thirty feet. Bounded Westward by River Alley Northward by Strawberry Alley Eastward by Lot Number 147, and Southward by Dewberry Street. As by the general plan of said Town remaining in the Surveyor General's Office will appear, Returned into the Secretary's Office, the 18<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1773 for William Maclay Esq. by Warrant dated the 11<sup>th</sup> June, 1773.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this second day of October, 1905.
