



The Land Possessed by Thomas James was Originally Surveyed to John Mordant for 500^{ac} which upon the General Resurvey was Reported by David Powell to Contain 607^{ac} and upon the said Powell's Return the same was Confirmed by Patent (as I am Informed) to Col. Evans It is Described bounding on the East side of Thomas Jerman's Land making the same Corners at Both ends 496 perches in length and 196 p. in Breadth At the Northern End of the said Tract the Corner Common to both is signified in the above Draught by an heap of stones In the Year 1789 After Abel Griffith Obtained a Patent for 4^{ac} Land adjoining on y^e North End of Thomas James's The said James Alledged that his Tract was Deficient in Quantity Therefore y^e Proprietor at his Desire Ordered a Resurvey which was made Oct 19th of 12th Mo 1789 And the said Tract which by David Powell's estimation Contained 607^{ac} was then found to Contain 630^{ac} being 480 per. in Length and 210 p. in Breadth
