



In pursuance of an Order from the Commissioner of Property dated the 16th day of June 1872, a survey was made on the 3^d day of July following for David Harris, Jun^r of a certain Lot of Ground, in the Town of Danbury in the County of Northumberland, Numbered in a General Plan of said Town, Number sixty one, containing in Breadth North and South Fifty seven feet, six inches, and in length East and West Two hundred and thirty feet, Bounded westward by Broad Way, Northward by Mulberry Alley, Eastward by River Alley, and Southward by Lot Number Sixty two. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 2nd day of September, 1873, for John Harris of Paxton, by Warrant dated the 21st Instant.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twenty seventh day of January, 1905,
