15 May 1828 - 11 September 1829

This estimate book, the counterpart No. 1 of which is lacking, was maintained in various hands, but closed on the date indicated by Assistant Engineer Hother Hage in the Liverpool canal office.

The contents bear upon estimates and actual costs, section by section, of excavating, grubbing, puddling, etc.; of locks, aqueducts, fencing, and the like.

Here, items 1-118 present, almost without exception on printed forms, Articles of Agreement between Acting Commissioner Charles Mowry and contractors in 1827 and 1828, to dig, embank, puddle, and construct, etc. sections of the canal in accordance with plans drawn by Engineer Simeon Guilford.

Among the names of contractors is that of Simon Cameron.
