Gay, engineer; Simon Gratz, president of the Wiconisco Coal Company; James Hopkins, builder and owner of the Hopkins Canal of which, in item 37, he furnishes an excellent draught showing its relation to Falmouth and the Conewago Falls; Wm. K. Huffnagle, engineer; J. B. Lyon, supervisor; Francis Rawn Shunk, secretary to the Canal Board; A. B. Warford, engineer; and Dr. Charles T. Whippo, engineer, earlier the builder of the North Branch Division Canal to Nanticoke
