HIRAM GILBERT ANDREWS COLLECTION

1890-1964

Hiram G. Andrews, Democrat, resided in Johnstown, Cambria County. He was elected to the Penna. House of Representatives in 1932, 1934, 1938, 1944, 1946, 1948, 1950, 1952, 1954, 1956, 1958, 1960. He was Minority Floor Leader during the sessions of 1945, 1947, 1949, 1951 and 1953; Speaker of the House 1955; Minority Whip first half of session of 1957; Minority Floor Leader second half of session of 1957; reelected Speaker of the House 1959, 1960, and 1961. He lost his bid for reelection against Republican, Cecil K. Leberknight in the 1962 election.
