

GEN. RICHARD COULTER PAPERS, 1786-1908

Private and military papers of Richard Coulter and his family. He was an attorney in Greensburg, Westmoreland County. He served as a private in the Mexican War and commander of the 11th Regt., P.V., in the Civil War. He was wounded in the battles of Fredericksburg, Gettysburg, and Spottsylvania. After the war he entered banking and the coal business. Muster rolls were transferred to the Adjutant General File.
