1. Colonel Hartranft as colonel of 51st Pennsylvania. Full-length photo with sword (presentation) from Norristown and full colonel's outfit minus hat. Circa 1863. Carte de Visite. [George Linzi, Photographer, Norristown].
- 2a. Major General Hartranft. Head and shoulders photograph. Uniform of Brigadier General but shoulder straps of Major General. Circa 1865. Carte de Visite.
- 2b. Reverse of 2a, showing imprint of Alexander Gardner, photographer, Washington, D.C.
3. Tattered flag of 51st Pennsylvania. Carte de Visite.
4. Third Division flag. Cabinet size photograph. 3 1/2" x 4 1/2".
5. Major General Hartranft in Washington, D.C. Shoulder strap and stars of Major General. Uniform of Brigadier General. Medium sized photograph. Circa 1865.
6. Major General Hartranft in correct uniform with sash across shoulder from right to left. Four medals appear on the uniform. Carte de Visite.
7. Major General Hartranft in full dress uniform with four medals and sash. c. 1880's. 4" x 5" mount.
8. Major General Hartranft in full dress uniform with four medals and sash. 2 1/4" x 3". 4" x 5" mount. (Duplicate of Photo 7).
9. Major General Hartranft in full dress uniform with four medals and sash. Oval photo. 3" x 5". [F. Gutekunst, Photographer]. (Duplicate of Photo 7).
10. Major General Hartranft in full dress uniform with four medals and sash. Similar to Photo 9; different pose. [Photograph not copied].
11. Major General Hartranft in full dress uniform with four medals and sash. Print taken from a book. 4 3/4" x 6 1/2". (Duplicate of Photo 10). [Photograph not copied].

Major General Hartranft in short coat with single row of buttons and Major General shoulder strap and General Sheridan in full dress with epaulettes of Lieutenant General. Sash right to left. General Hartranft not wearing Medal of Honor. therefore pre-1886. [Carbon print by F. Gutekunst]. Photograph mounted. 8" x 6".

20. Burnside Bridge at Antietam. Assaulted by 51st Pennsylvania and 51st New York on September 17, 1862. Colonel Hartranft led first 51st Pennsylvania in initial successful assault over bridge. Copy of Carte de Visite. 4 1/8" x 2 1/2".

21. Reunion photo of assault of Burnside Bridge at Antietam. Major General Hartranft in front of 51st Pennsylvania Monument at bridge. Cut off photo. 6 1/2" x 10 1/2". Photograph found in its entirety at Montgomery County Historical Society.

22. Major General Hartranft seated outside tent with staff and family members. Single row of buttons with two stars. Major General on shoulder strap. [Betz and Richards photo from

Lancaster, PA.] 4" x 6".

23. Major General Hartranft and staff outside tent. Hartranft seated. Medal of Honor on uniform. Staff listed on back of photo. Circa 1886. Cyanotype photo. 7 1/2" x 4 1/2".

24. Major General Hartranft seated on bench near tent with all medals including Medal of Honor present. Four individuals seated right to left of Hartranft and identified on back of photo (J. Hartranft, Mr. Shadell, Lynn Hartranft, Mr. Woodman, Mr. Bently). Circa 1887-88. Cabinet size photograph. [S.H. Cope, Photographer]. 6 1/4" x 4".

25. Major General Hartranft seated on bench near tent with all medals including Medal of Honor present. Four individuals seated right to left of Hartranft. Circa 1887-1888. Matted on board. Albumen print. (Duplicate of Photo 24). 7 1/2" x 4 3/4".

26. Governor Beaver's staff under tent fly, taken at Connemaugh Lake. Circa 1888. Cabinet card. 6 1/2" x 4 1/2".

27. Officers of First Regiment Infantry of National Guard of Pennsylvania at Mt. Gretna, PA. One possibly Major General Hartranft, son of Colonel Hartranft. 1890. [This photograph is missing from the Hartranft-Stockham-Shireman Collection].

28. Company H, First Regiment, First Brigade, National Guard of Pennsylvania at Gettysburg. August 1884. [Taken by Philadelphia View Company, Philadelphia, PA.] 6 3/4" x 9 3/4".

29. General Hartranft's monument, 18301 Norristown, PA. Sent to Mr. Hartranft Stockham in Perryman, Maryland from Philadelphia. Dated January 31, 1908. Postcard. [Photograph not copied].
