

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Now ye, That in consideration of the services rendered by John Adams private — in the late Army of the United States Pennsylvania line, — there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto the said John Adams a certain tract of land No. 3211 called Adams' Tract in the Township of Redbank, Westmoreland Butler County Beginning at a Black Oak, thence by land North one hundred and thirty paces to a Post, thence by lot No. 110 East two hundred and sixty one paces to a white Oak, thence by lot No. 3211 South one hundred and thirty paces to a white Oak, and thence by vacant land West two hundred and sixty one paces to the Beginning containing two hundred acres and Allowance of six ft. Went for roads &c, 114. Tract was surveyed in pursuance of an Act of General Assembly passed 11th January 1785. — To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said John Adams his Heirs to the issue of him the said John Adams Heirs and Assigns forever: —

free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to Mines, Royalties, Quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all Silver Ore for the use of this Commonwealth, to be delivered at the Pitt's mouth, clear of all charges. In Testimony whereof, I have set my Hand, and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affix Present, at Lancaster this sixth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and four and of the Commonwealth the twenty-ninth. —
