

Now ye, That in consideration of the services rendered by Philip Kitcherick private in the army of the United States there is granted by the said commonwealth unto Clement Biddle esquire assignee of Alexander Power who was Assignee of Edward Harper who was Assignee of the said Philip Kitcherick —

a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of Allegheny on the West side of the Allegheny River in the sixth donation District, bounded and described as follows, to wit, Beginning at an Aspen-bush and running East by Sol Number 1208, one hundred and thirty perches to a Chestnut-tree thence South by Sol Number 1282, Two hundred and sixty one perches to a Stake; thence West by Sol number 109, one hundred and thirty perches, to a White-Cat; and thence North by Sol number 1284, Two hundred and sixty one perches to the place of beginning; containing Two hundred acres of Land and the usual allowance of six per Cent for Roads &c. Numbered among other Lots in the said District - MCCLXXXIII.

To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said Clement Biddle his heirs and assigns To and for his and their own proper Use and Benefit forever

free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the Pitt's mouth clear of all charges. In Testimony whereof I have set my Hand, and caused the great Seal of the State to be affixed to these Presents, at Philadelphia, this tenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety-five and of the commonwealth the Nineteenth
