KNOW YE,

Hutton private

That in consideration of the services rendered by James

in the late army of the United States,

there is granted by the said commonwealth unto the said James Hutton

a certain tract or parcel of land, lying in the county of Westmoreland

In the tenth district of donation Lands beginning at a Sugar Tree the Numbered Corner
and running East by Lot No 2003 two hundred and sixty one perches to a Sugar Tree
thence South by Vacant Lands one hundred and thirty perches to a Sugar Tree thence
West by Lot No 2005 two hundred and sixty one perches to a Sugar Tree thence North
by Lot No 2148 one hundred and thirty perches to the place of beginning Containing
six hundred Acres and allowance of Six per Cent for Roads and Numbered M^{III}

with its appurtenances, unto the said James Hutton his heirs and assigns forever:

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the

his heirs and assigns, to the proper use and behoof of the said
reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents, or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth
part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth
clear of all charges.
