To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

KNOW YE,

Sidwick Private

That in consideration of the services rendered by Joshua


in the late army of the United States

there is granted by the said commonwealth unto the said Joshua Sidwick, a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of Westmoreland In the tenth district of donation Lands, beginning at a Sugar Tree the Numbered Corner and running East by Lot 2001 two hundred and sixty one perches to a Birch Tree, thence South by Vacant Land one hundred and thirty perches to a Sugar Tree, thence West by Lot N° 270 two hundred and sixty one perches to a sugar Tree, thence North by Lot N° 250 one hundred and thirty perches to the place of beginning. Containing two hundred Acres and allowance of Sixty Cent for Roads &c. Numbered MM



with its appurtenances, unto the said Joshua Sidwick his heirs and assigns forever : TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Joshua Sidwick his heirs and assigns, to the proper use and behoof of the said Joshua Sidwick his heirs and assigns forever, free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth clear of all charges. IN WITNESS whereof The Honorable Charles Biddle Esquire, President of the Supreme Executive Council, hath hereunto set his hand, and caused the state seal to be affixed the twenty sixth day of April — in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven, and of the commonwealth the Eleventh
