

The Supreme Executive Council of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

**KNOW YE,** That in consideration of the services rendered by William Reynolds (deceased) late a private in the army of the United States there is granted by the said commonwealth unto William Banquett Administrator of the Goods and Chattels Rights and Credits of the said William Reynolds deceased

a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of Westmoreland in the tenth district of donation Lands beginning at an Ash Tree the numbered corner and running East by lot No 2081 two hundred and sixty one perches to a spruce tree thence South by lot No 2009 one hundred and thirty perches to a sugar Tree thence West by lot No 2079 two hundred and fifty one perches to a post thence North by lots No 193 and 192 one hundred and thirty perches to the place of beginning Containing Two-hundred Acres and allowance of six per cent for Roads &c Numbered MMLXXX

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said William Banquett his heirs and assigns forever, in trust Nevertheless and to and for the use of himself and the Heirs of the said William Reynolds deceased according to the laws of this Commonwealth free and clear of all restrictions and

reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth clear of all charges. IN WITNESS whereof

The Honorable Charles Biddle Esquire, Vice President of the Supreme Executive Council, hath hereunto set his hand, and caused the State seal to be affixed, the twenty ninth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven and of the Commonwealth the twelfth.
