

The Supreme Executive Council of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

KNOW YE,

That in consideration of the services rendered by William
Williams private in the late army of the United States
there is granted by the said commonwealth unto The said William Williams
a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county of Westmoreland

In the tenth district of donation Lands beginning at an Ash Tree the numbered
Corner and running East by Lot No 1993 two hundred and fifty one perches to an
Ironwood Tree, thence South by Lot No 162 one hundred and thirty perches to
a Beech Tree, thence West by Lot No 1991 two hundred and sixty one perches to
a sugar Tree, thence North by Vacant Land one hundred and thirty perches
to the place of beginning Containing Two hundred Acres and allowance of six
per Cent for Roads &c Numbered MDCCCXII

with its appurtenances, unto the said William Williams his heirs and assigns forever:

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract or parcel of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto
the said William Williams his heirs and assigns, to the proper use and behoof of the said
William Williams his heirs and assigns forever, free and clear of all restrictions and
reservations as to mines, royalties, quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth
part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this commonwealth, to be delivered at the pit's mouth
clear of all charges. IN WITNESS whereof The Honorable Charles Biddle
Esquire Vice President of the Supreme Executive Council, hath hereunto set his hand, and caused
the state seal to be affixed the Nineteenth day of February in the year of our Lord one
thousand seven hundred and eighty-seven, and of the commonwealth the Eleventh
