


This Indenture Witnesseth that John Wilson, aged nine years the thirtieth day of December (Inst. 1813) by and with the advice and consent of his Uncle and next friend Daniel Williams and consent of his Mother Fanny Wilson manifested by their signatures hereto hath bound and put himself, and by these presents doth bind and put himself an apprentice to Samuel Colhoun of Chambersburg Franklin County and State of Pennsylvania after the manner of an apprentice to do with and serve the said Samuel Colhoun his heirs Executors administrators or assigns from the day and date hereof and during, and until he arrives to the age of twenty one years thence ensuing, and fully to be complete and ended during all which term the said apprentice his said Master faithfully shall serve, and that honestly & obediently in all things, as a dutiful Apprentice ought to do.

And the said Samuel Colhoun his heirs Executors administrators or assigns shall teach, cause to be taught, and instruct the said apprentice in the art, trade and mystery of a Farmer and shall and will provide for the said apprentice sufficient meat, drink, physic clothing washing lodging and to give s^d apprentice clothing worth Eighteen Dollars, or Eighteen Dollars in cash at the option of s^d apprentice besides his common wearing appare. And for the true performance of all and singular the covenants and agreements aforesaid the parties bind themselves each unto the other, firmly by these presents In Witness whereof the said parties have hereunto interchangeably set their hands and seals this fourth day of December Anno dⁿⁱ 1813 one thousand eight hundred and thirteen.
