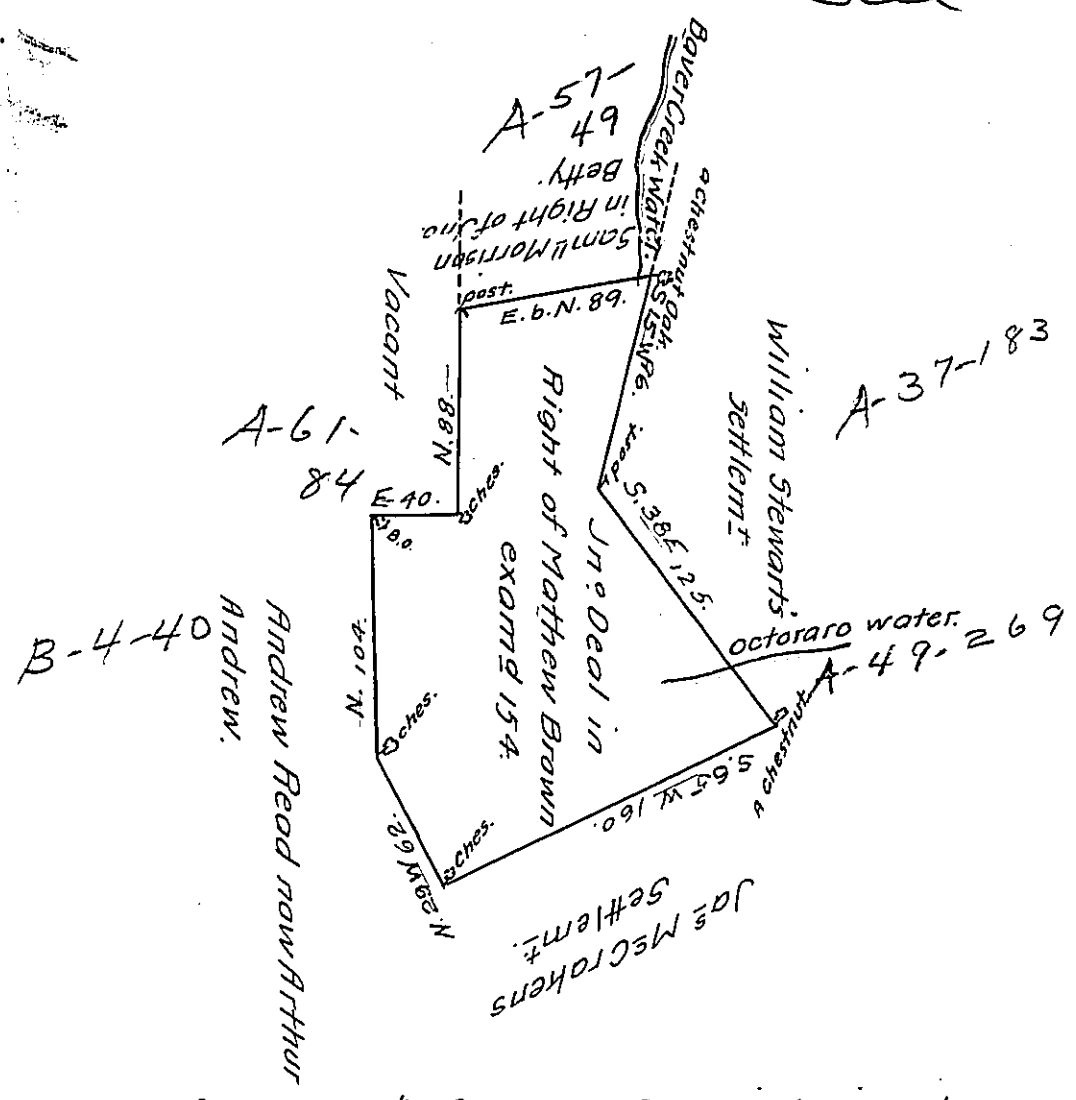

By virtue of a warrant from ye Proprietaries to mee Directed bearing Date the 27th day of Nov^r A.D, 1736 survey'd unto Mathew Brown on ye 22^d Day of ye 2^d mo call'd April, A.D, 1737 a Tract of Land situate in the Township of Sadsbury & County of Lancaster Beginning at a Corner Chestnut standing Near James M^cCraken's Settlement; thence by lands Seated by ye sd M^cCraken, South 65° westerly 160 perches to a chestnut Corner thence N. 29° w. by land Settled by Andrew Read 62 perches to a Chestnut thence North by vacant land 104 perches to a Corner black oak thence East 40 perches by Vacant Land, thence North by vacant Land 88 perches to a post thence by Jno Betty's land East by North 89 perches to a Chestnut oak a Corner of Jno Betty-land standing near a Spring Head thence S. 15° W: 96 perches by land settled by Will^m Stewart to a post thence by the sd Settlement S. 38° E. 125 perches to ye Beginning Containing one Hundred & fifty four acres & the usual allowance of 60^s p^r c^t for Road Differance of Survey, &c.
