hundred & fifty Acres he purch-obl- -These are to will-obl-Require

-obl- in this County beyond Tekony 3 or 4 miles from y<sup>e</sup> River, as  
square & convenient is may be in a place where not already taken  
up, according to y<sup>e</sup> method of Townships appointed by me, and  
make returns thereof into my Secretary's Office. Given at Phil-  
adelphia y<sup>e</sup> 22<sup>nd</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> 1683.
