By Vertue of a warrant from the Proprietaries to me directed bearing date the twenty ninth day of July Anno Dom 1734. I have Resurveyed on the nineteenth day of September Anno Dom 1734 unto John Fisher Part of the Island formerly granted by the Governour of New York unto Peter Cock since deceased, under whose Heirs the said John Fisher now holds the said Part which is bounded on the East by Schuylkil River, on the South by the River Delaware, on the west by Eagle Creek [which divides the said John Fisher's part from Samuel Carpenter's part of the said Island] And on the North by a Creek called Minchers Creek [wch divides the sd. John Fisher's part from Boon's part of the said Island] Contain-
ing three hundred forty two acres. Returned into the Secretary's Office the tenth day of October, Anno Dom 1734.
