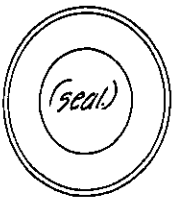

William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Governour in Chief
of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed.

At the Request of Thomas Withers, That I would grant him to take up
one hundred Acres of Land part thereof in right of an old Purchase made by his
father William Withers, said to be not yet fully laid out to him the other part to
be now purchased. These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to
be Survey'd unto him the said Number of one hundred Acres of Land in this
Province that has not been yet Survey'd, ~~take up~~, nor ~~is~~ concealed, to be
laid out according to the Method of Townships by me appointed, And
make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand
and Seal at Philadelphia the 28th day of the 10th Moth, 1700.
