William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Govern^r in Chief
of the Province of Pennsylvania and Counties annexed.

According to the Primitiv^l Regulation for Laying out of lands
in this Province by which it was provided that one tenth Part of
all the Lands therein survey'd should be appropriated to me the
Proprietary thereof. I do hereby require and command thee to
survey or cause to be survey'd to my proper use and behoof and
my heirs after me, five hundred Acres in every Township consist-
ing of five thousand acres that shall be survey'd and generally
one tenth part of all the lands that shall be laid out in this Prov-
ince or Territories and make due Returns thereof into my Sec-
retaries Office. Given under my hand and seal the firstth day
of 7^{ber} 1700.
