These are to authorize and require thee to resurvey or cause to be resurveyed the front Street Lot and the addition thereunto made (which together contain one hundred and ten feet in breadth on the front and second streets from Delaware Bank) appurtenant and belonging to the original purchase of five Thousand acres of Land within our Province made by our late Grand father Thomas Callowhill since deceased the Right whereof being now vested in us or one of us and ^{make} return of the same into our Secretary's Office in order for Confirmation in such manner as we shall think fit to direct and appoint and in so doing this shall be thy sufficient warrant

Given under my hand and the seal of our Land Office at Philad^a this 5th day of May Anno Dom. 1741.
