

By vertue of a war<sup>t</sup> from Edward Penington Survey<sup>r</sup> Gener<sup>ll</sup>  
 bearing date the 7<sup>th</sup> of ye 8<sup>th</sup> m<sup>o</sup> 1700. directed unto me I hereby cer-  
 tify into his office that I have survey'd and laid out the 15<sup>th</sup> of the 9<sup>th</sup>  
 m<sup>o</sup> ensueing unto Susana Reading a certain tract of land in the County  
 of Philadelphia beginneing at a stake sett in ground in a line of Edward  
 ffarmer and company's land from thenc- by the said line of marked  
 trees south west two hundred thierly-eight perches to a stake sett in  
 the ground by a hickry marked ffrom thenc-north west by a line  
 of marked trees by the land known by the name of George Keeths  
 Land three hundred and thierly six perches and a quarter from thenc-  
 north-east by a line of marked trees two hundred and thierly-eight  
 perches from thenc-south east three hundred and thierly-six  
 P<sup>r</sup>ches and a quarter to the place of beginneing containing and  
 laid out five hundred acres of land
