William Henry Egle (b.1830, d.1901), a native of Harrisburg, served through the Civil War as surgeon. From 1871 he engaged in historical research and wrote several volumes. He was State Librarian from 1887-1899 and edited the 2nd and 3rd Series of the published archives.
