



In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Dated the 13th Day of March Anno Dom. 1734 for Surveying unto Henry Dasher one hundred & fifty acres of Land near Sulphoon in the County of Lancaster there was surveyed a certain Tract of Land situate on a Branch of the Great Springs Creek a Branch of Sulphoon Creek in the said County Beginning at a post at a Corner of John Reichert's Land thence extending by the same Land North 50 1/2 Deg. West 140 Pches to a marked Black Oak & South 39 1/2 Deg. West 9 Pches to a marked black oak thence by the same & vacant Land North 60 1/2 Deg. West 130 Pches to a large white oak marked thence by vacant Land North 59 1/2 Deg. East 170 Pches to a black oak marked South 50 1/2 Deg. East 155 Pches to a small white oak marked and South 180 Pches to the place of Beginning Containing one hundred and Eighty eight acres & one hundred & eight perches and the usual allowance of 6 pches for Roads &c. Survey'd ye 16th Day of July A^o 1737
