



By Warrant from Proprietaries dated the 13th of Apr: 1734 Surveyed and
on the Twenty sixth day of May 1734 to Thomas Collins a Tract of Land
Situate on the East Side of ye River Schuylkill in the County of Philadelphia:
Beginning at a Maple Tree on the Bank of ye s^d River thence by Land of
Moses Coats North Seventy Degrees oblique Three hundred and seventy perches
to a Black Oak Sycamore corner oblique Moses Coats Land thence by
Vacant Land South Twenty degrees East Eightyfour perches to a post about
ten feet West from a Chestnut Oak marked with three notches thence
by Vacant Land south Seventy degrees West Four hundred and fifty perches
to a Dead Black Oak on the Bank of ye s^d River thence up the same to the
place of Beginning. Containing Two hundred acres with usual allowances.
