



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries bearing date the second Day of february Anno Domini 1737 I have Surveyed and Laid Out unto Patrick Casson in the Township of Pennsborough in the County of Lancaster on the West side Susquehanna River Two hundred and ninety acres with the allowance of 6 yd. Canal.

Beginning at a White a Corner of Robt Wills Land Thence North Twenty Degrees Easterly Two hundred and sixty perches to a post Thence North Seventy Degrees Westerly Two hundred and twenty four perches to a Spanish Oak, Thence South Twenty Degrees Westerly one hundred and eighty perches to a post, Thence South fifty Degrees Easterly Two hundred and thirty eight perches to the place of Beginning, Surveyed April 1<sup>st</sup>/1738.
